Poison hemlock is that invasive and dangerous plant is blooming in Pennsylvania. This is poisonous to humans and livestock. If you have this on your property please remove it. Trilby Libhart, the state's botany, and weed specialist, said the plant spreads easily. The Tree of Heaven is an aggressive root system that can cause damage to pavement, sewers and building foundations. The plant has also helped advance the spread of the spotted lanternfly. If you have either of these on you property it would be best to remove them.

Spotted Lanternfly
Spotted lanternflies are invasive and can be spread long distances by people who move infested material or items containing egg masses. Smoking/ Home Fire Safety Be Alert! To prevent a deadly cigarette fire, you must be alert. You won't be alert if you are sleepy, have taken medicine, or drugs that make you drowsy or have consumed alcohol. **NEVER SMOKE IN BED.**

Facts: 1) The risk of dying in a home structure fire caused by smoking materials rises with age. 2) One out of four fatal victims of smoking-material fires is not the

smoker whose cigarette started the fire.
Smoking Safety
*Only use fire-safe cigarettes.
*Smoke outside, most deaths result from fires that started in the living rooms, family rooms, and dens or in bedrooms. *Keep cigarettes, lighters, matches, and other smoking materials up high out of the reach of children, in a locked cabinet. *Use a deep, sturdy ashtray. Place it away from anything that can burn. *Don't discard cigarettes in vegetation such as mulch, potted plants or landscaping, peat moss, dried grasses, leaves, or other things that could ignite easily. *Before you throw away butts and ashes, make sure they are out, and dousing in water or sand is the best way to do that.
